PARTICULARS OF ORGANIZATION, FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES

This Institute was established in March, 1972 as Central Research Institute (Ayurveda) at Unit-1, Bhubaneswar. Later on, it was up-graded to National Research Institute of Ayurvedic Drug Development (NRIADD) in 2009 vide council's letter no.F.No.12-30/2009-CCRAS/Estt. Dated 15.12.2009 and subsequently shifted to its own building at Bharatpur, Bhubaneswar during February 2012. It has been renamed as Central Ayurveda Research Institute for Hepatobiliary Disorders (CARIHD) in 2016 vide council's letter no.F.No.12-30/2009-CCRAS/Estt./313 Dated 12.05.2016. Further it has been renamed as Central Ayurveda Research Institute (CARI) in 2021 vide council's letter no.F.No.12-39/2015-CCRAS/Estt./4788; Dated 22/12/2020. This Institute is serving the public through its OPD services along with 50 bedded IPD facilities which are supported by Bio-Chemistry-Pathology laboratory, Mini Pharmacy Section, Panchakarma Section, Ano-rectal Clinic, Leech therapy Clinic and Marma Chikitsa Therapy.

This Institute has its own Institutional Ethical Committee in order to get approvals for conducting various clinical research projects time to time allocated by the Council (CCRAS).

This Institute observed the International Yoga Day, Vigilance Awareness Week, National Ayurveda Day, Hindi Workshops, Hindi Pakhwada, Swachha Pakhwada, Ayush for Immunity Campaign, Constitutional Day, PoshanMaha, Azadi ka Amrut Mahotsav, etc. during the year.

Resources are generated regularly from the patients through OPD, IPD, Panchakarma, Ksharasutra OT, Marma OPD, Laboratory & sailing of CCRAS's books through Library section and the amount with interest are send to the Council regularly.

This Institute runs a Mini Pharmacy having GMP (Good Manufacturing Practice) certificate from the Department of Ayush, Govt. of Odisha to cater the need of OPD/IPD patients where simple drugs/classical compound formulations of different dosage forms like Taila, Churna etc. are prepared and supplied to its OPD and IPD sections of the hospital.

Three numbers of Clinical Research Projects were carried out during the reporting year, viz. (1) Systems Biology approach to delineate molecular signatures of Prakriti in healthy humans. (2) Clinical Efficacy and Safety of Arogyavardhinivati and Pippalyadyasava in the management of Non-Alcoholic Fatty Liver Disease (NAFLD): An Open Label Prospective Study. (3) Efficacy and safety of Ayurveda Formulation 'Trikatu' as add-on to standard care in Dyslipidemia-A Randomized Controlled Trial.

Literary/Documentation research project named Documentation of life profiles of Luminaries in Ayurveda was assigned during the reporting year. For the documentation of life profiles of 8 luminaries in Ayurveda of Odisha State, which have been documented and under process of publication.

Outreach programmes like Tribal Health Care Research Project (THCRP), Ayurveda Mobile Healthcare Programme under Scheduled Caste Sub Plan (AMHCP-SCSP) and Women and Child Health (WCH) Under Scheduled Caste Sub Plan (SCSP) have been carried out by the Institute.

Under THCRP, during the reporting year (2023-24), 07 villages of Udala Block of Mayurbhanj districts and a total of 6859 (new 2372+ old 4487) patients were provided suitable treatment. To achieve the target, THCRP team was made 197 visits to cover the populations. Under this Programme, one projects was carried out entitled. Effectiveness of composite Ayurveda Regimen in a black box design for the management of Rheumatoid Arthritis- A community based study under THCRP. A total number of 40 participants were completed the study.

Under SCSP, During the reporting year, a total number of 3750 population was covered from 05 villages of Khurda districts and a total of 9341 (New 3884+ Old 5457) patients were provided suitable treatment. SCSP team was made 222 visits to cover the populations. Under this programme one project was entitled (Effectiveness of Ayush Rasayana ‘A’ & ‘B’ on quality of life of Elderly population) carried out and completed successfully.

The present work “Women and Child Health Care Program under Scheduled Caste Sub Plan” aims to document the data regarding study of living conditions, geographical and environmental profile of Scheduled caste Women and children in the selected villages near Bhubaneswar through door to door Survey. Medical care was provided by organizing camps in villages. Clinical study on Primary dysmenorrhea is carried out for young adult girls and women complaining of painful menstruation without any associated pelvic pathology. And Ayurvedic formulations such as Rajapravartani Vatiⁱ and Saraswatarishta were distributed among the screened and selected patients full filing the criteria for enrollment for the treatment of primary dysmenorrhea.

A total number of **3811** women and children population were surveyed through **204** Tours; Out of which **1646** patients suffering from various diseases were treated during last year. **46** nos of young adult female suffering from painful menstruation(Dysmenorrhea) enrolled for the clinical trial of “Effectiveness of Rajapravartini Vati and Saraswatarishta in Dysmenorrhea - A prospective community based study”.

The “Swachha Bharat Mission” was conducted by the Institute as per the guidelines.

The Institute has also been recognized as a nodal Centre to impart PhD (Ayurveda) study affiliated under Utkal University. During the reporting year 2022-23, total 17 PhD scholars have continued their PhD work in the Institute.

The library section of the Institute contains 2434 books up to previous year.

During the reporting period the scientists of this Institute participated in various scientific seminars/webinars/training and published 13 nos. of scientific papers in various reputed / peer reviewed / indexed journals and one book chapter.

Reproductive /Women and child Health Care Programme under SCSP

The State of Odisha occupies an important place in the country having a high population of Scheduled Tribe and Scheduled Caste. As per the latest 2011 census, it is ranked third (numerically) and eleventh position (numerically) in terms of ST and SC population, respectively in the country. The Scheduled Tribes (22.85%) and Scheduled Castes (17.13%) constitute about 40% of the total population of the state of Odisha. It has the unique distinction of having 93 different Scheduled Caste communities spread over 30 districts and 314 blocks of the state.

The Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India, is implementing "Central Sector Scheme of Special Central Assistance (SCA) to Scheduled Castes Sub Plan (SCSP)" since 1980 for the development of Scheduled Castes who form the major chunk of the country's population living below the poverty line. Strategy of the Scheduled Caste Sub Plan for socio-economic empowerment and inclusive development of Scheduled Castes (SCs) was introduced in the Sixth Five Year Plan for channelizing the funds to the Scheduled castes to avail their due share of plan benefits and outlays. Under the Scheduled Castes Development Bureau, the Ministry implements the Schedules Caste Sub-Plan (SCSP), which is an umbrella strategy to ensure flow of targeted financial and physical benefits from all the general sectors of development for the benefit of Scheduled Castes. At present 27 States/UTs having sizeable SC population are implementing Schedules Caste Sub-Plan. As per the objectives mentioned in the guidelines of Special Central Assistance to Scheduled caste Sub plan (SCA to SCSP), only those schemes should be included that ensure direct benefits to individuals or families belonging to Scheduled castes and priority should be given for providing basic minimum services. As a part of this, from the funds allocated to Ministry of Ayush, Central Council for Research in Ayurvedic Sciences (CCRAS), initiated Reproductive and Child Health Care Programme/Women and Child Healthcare Programme under Scheduled Caste Sub plan (SCSP) to undertake outreach health care services through its 10 peripheral institutes rendering clinical services. Central Ayurveda Research institute, Bhubaneswar has undertaken the current programme since 2015 to provide health care through Ayurveda and to observe the health status of women & children in the areas predominantly dwelled by the scheduled castes through outreach OPDs and health camps.

Aim:

To provide health care to women and children through Ayurveda in areas of predominantly dwelled by SC people.

Primary Objectives:

1) To provide health care services to Women & children through Ayurveda interventions (as adjuvant to the ongoing treatment if any) for various disease conditions through outreach OPDs and health camps.
