

Efficacy of G7 in the management of Allergic and Inflammatory disorders – An in Vitro Study

Abstract

An allergic reaction of the skin is described in Siddha as Kanakkadi (unknown insect bite or unknown factor). In Siddha practice, the management of Atopy is done by surface applicants and internal Drug Therapy. Sometimes purgation is done prior to starting the treatment. Arugam pul thailam (*Cynadon dactylon*), water paste of Kuppai meni (*Acalypha indica*) and so on are followed in traditional practice. Madhusunki, Amalaki, Aswagandha, Akashagarudan, Kundali are drugs found effective in management of Atopy. Combination of the above herbs with shank and Gandhaka enhances the therapeutic effect of the medicine. Clinically this drug is recommended even for long term therapy, since, it does not produce any adverse effect.
